#### Divyajyoti Trust in service of New born

Divyajyoti Trust was established with the objective - "Nobody should become needlessly blind" since last 10 years at Mandvi, Dist. Surat.

100 bedded Tejas Eye Hospital run by Divyajyoti Trust is functional basically for eye care activity which is explained herewith in this report. Over & above we are helping other voluntary organisations involved in health care activity by sending our technical staff and/or doctors or both once or twice Divyajyoti in service of new born.

Generally premature babies or low birth weight babies are given oxygen for long period of time and they need special neonatal care i.e. keep them in incubator and this may harm their retina. So it is mandatory to check their retina & cure them if required. This needs to be done as early as possible & treat them within few days. This can prevent them from blindness. We are assisting (1) Shrimad Rajchandra Hospital - Dharampur (2) Gram Seva Trust - Kharel & (3) Sewa Rural - Jhagadia for ROP screening. Providing such facility, we are able to save 2-3 infants from blindness every month; which gives us immense pleasure & satisfaction.

From this year, we have started visiting Modi Children Hospital for ROP screening as per request of hospital authority.

#### Divyajyoti Trust, committed for Eco-friendly activity

The trust is concerned about environment protection since beginning. While renovating old 'Luster Diamond' building, we ensured to install solar street light, solar power generating system, solar water heater & LED bulbs.

The new building behind hospital "Smt. Chandraben Piyushbhai Kothari Parivar Netrajyoti Training Centre" was constructed with a concept of green building. We used kota-stone instead of tiles; Aluminium, glass or second hand wood were used instead of plastic-fibre material. Ceiling fans installed are also energy saver. Constructed under ground tank with a capacity to store 2 lakh litre for rain water harvesting. Special dual plumbing work was done for recycling bathwater. Biogas plant; steam cooker, solar water heater & solar power generating plant have been installed. All these efforts were awarded by Indian Green Building Council with a Platinum category Certificate.

We could save the energy & by that means helped eco-friendly movement a little bit as stated here under:

- (1) We could store total 10 lakh litre rain water during 6 years.
- (2) We could save 7.5 lakh litre water by installing water-less urinal.
- (3) Recycled 50 lakh litre used water.
- (4) The water drained from A.C. which is distilled water used in autoclave and by this we could save 12,096 litre water. In addition to this, rest of water which is required in autoclave is hot water heated by solar water heater & saved 12940 unit/year electricity.
- (5) 1,91,204 units electricity generated through solar power plant.
- (6) Rs.14445/year saved by solar water heater.
- (7) 1000 kg of cooking gas is saved as fuel generated through bio-gas plant.

Patient's expenditure to visit Mandvi for their eye related issues is saved as they are now being examined at 8 vision centers & 3 satellite centers and indirectly we helped to reduce carbon emission to that extent.

It's our immense pleasure to present 11th Annual Report to you.

Divyajyoti Trust was registered on 19 January-2010, so we have completed 10 years on 19 January-2020 & hospital became functional on 22-5-11 so 10 years of hospital were completed on 22-5-21. We have reached performance of 13000 surgeries annually from 3600 surgeries performed in the first year.

Due to corona pandemic, work has drastically reduced from last week of March-2020. During April-2020 to March-2021, the work reduced upto 60% compared to previous year. Fund from Government as reimbursement was reduced. We requested our donors to help us and here we thankfully note that they donated generously, though they may be in a difficult situation themselves in this pandemic. Words will fall short to express our gratitude towards the love they showered on us.

Due to this great help we could continue our work and maintain our mental stability.

During covid period, first we prepared guideline to follow for staff & patients so that they may not get infected. All staff members were imparted training, provided sanitizers, mask, gloves, face shield etc & made necessary changes in infrastructure.

Vyara satellite centre was handed over to the Government to run as covid designated centre.

Surat Manay Seva Sangh started providing ready to eat food packets to needy people during covid time. Divyajyoti Trust helped them by providing a vehicle with driver, to distribute the food packets & for other relevant task.

During the pandemic, some of our staff members also had corona infection but by grace of God, all recovered with home quarantine & resumed the duty again.

On 17th January; foundation stone laying ceremony was carried out at Amalsadi and construction work has been started from 31st January. This project needs huge amount of fund, so all are requested to donate generously for the same. Hope you will help us like previous years.

#### GR Gratitude to the society 20

If we have faith in God, there is no need of any proof!! As said above, we have not seen God but experienced thy blessings always. During our 10 years journey, we had so many challenges, ups and downs and dilema of hope-disappointment. But by grace of God, we came out of all that & moved forward.

If we talk about our initial stage, when decided to establish a trust & serve poor tribal interior area of Surat district, we had only experience of 20 years in eye care. Financial support, the location for a hospital and trained staff all were only in our imagination.

In this situation, first of all Dr. Bhadraben Shah came forward with a donation of big amount in memory of her husband Late Shri Bharatbhai through Share & Care Foundation.

After that Shri Bharatbhai Shah - Vice President (At that time) of "Chhayando" & other trustees Shri Shyamsundarji Biyani (Now no more), Shri Ramnarayan Chandak, Shri Laljibhai Patel & Shri Omprakashji Tuteja, Shri Balubhai Patel & two ophthalmologists from Ahmedabad Dr. Bakulbhai Trivedi & Dr. Amishbhai Patel; Shri Vijaybhai Kania from Surat; Philanthropist and leading personality of Mandvi - Shri Nalinbhai Shah; Shri Bhikhubhai Vyas from Vedchhi Pradesh Seva Samiti & Advocate of Mumbai Shri Subhashbhai Shah joined & created the trust board.

After registration of the trust - Divyajyoti Trust in January 2010, we searched for a building to run the hospital or a piece of land to construct the same around Mandvi. The owner of "Luster Diamond Co." offered us a building on long term lease with a goodwill. The same was renovated & converted into 40 bedded eye hospital. For the renovation work, structural engineer Kamal Parekh & Hansa Parekh & Civil engineer Shri Vijaybhai Kania came forward & under their guidance renovation work was completed within given time limit.

Advocate Shri Rohanbhai Chudawala guided us for legal requirements of charity commissioner office, free of cost.

We had started our camp activity while renovation work was going on. The screening of patients was done at Poonamwadi - Mandvi & surgery was done at Sewa Rural Jhagadia.

For renovation work, our donors Shri Laljibhai Patel (Kutch-Surat), C.A. Jay Chheira, Shri Subhashbhai Shah of Lilavati R. Shah Medical Relief Trust; Terapanth Samaj - Udhna; Shri Hariram Charitable Trust; Shri D.T. The main donors for kitchen are Shri Lavjibhai Prajapati; Smt. Laxmiben Umedbhai Patel; Shri Rameshbhai Gulabhai Patel; Shri Kunjan Durlabhbhai Patel & Dr. Shashikant Shah.

For latest equipments & machineries dealer Shri Ravikumar Mehra of Mehra Eyetech Co. Mumbai helped us generously. Similarly Shri Sunilbhai Dalal & Smt. Swatiben Dalal; Trustees of Dhun Pestonji Parakh Charitable Trust and officers of KAPS helped us to establish speciality clinics. We are very much thankful to them.

Technical training of our nursing staff & ophthalmic assistant was done at Seva Rural Jhagadia free of cost.

During last 10 years, the continuous support from Vision Foundation of India; Mision for Vision; Bhansali Trust; Jwelex India Pvt. Ltd. made our journey smooth & successful.

District Blindness Control Society (DBCS) & Rastriya Bima Yojna scheme provide a fix amount for surgeries & is very useful.

Over and above there are number of known-unknown donors whose names are not included. We are thankful to all our donors for their continuous support. If we have missed out names of any donor, please forgive us. Attempt here is to express our gratitude towards all donors & well wishers without whose support, this work could not have become possible.



#### The year at a glance

Year 2020-21 was a real challenge for the whole world due to COVID-19 pandemic. National lockdown was declared from 22nd March and that impacted the volume of work. Camps planned in advance were cancelled. Operations were reduced & base hospital OPD came down to almost 10-20 daily. This effect remained till 11th May 2020, after that it gradually started increasing again.

During this pandemic, we studied different guidelines for hospitals safety and prepared our own guideline for working during pandemic. To implement the guidelines, necessary changes were made. All the staff members were trained. The training of vision centre & satellite centre staff was done online.

Our maintenance department assembled "No touch senitizer dispenser" from hardware material available inhouse. The slit lamp & indirect ophthalmoscops were covered by breath shield. Over and above all, they repaired fused LED bulbs and reused them. All front-line workers were being provided face shield prepared from OHP sheet. Our house keeping staff prepared linen mask and we distributed them to our staff and sold them to the patients visiting hospital at the rate of Rs.15/- per piece.

During COVID-19 pandemic; Vyara satellite centre was handed over to Government of Gujarat to run as COVID care centre. We also offered our ventilator facility and hospital as and when in need for COVID patients to Government.

During this period "Chhayando" provided free food to needy people for almost 2-3 months. Total 55 lakh food packets were distributed in three months, a mamoth task was accomplished & it was really very helpful to the people trying to go back home. Divyajyoti Trust provided vehicle with driver to collect rotis prepared by ladies (housewives) from different area and distribute ready food packets to needy as a part of this kind humanitarian work.

Vision centres, which were closed from 24th March, restarted from 5th May and surgery & speciality clinics at hospital started from 11th May.

Regular OPD and OT work had reduced, the free time was utilised to prepare articles on different topics. Dr. Udaybhai was a team member in formation of "Post COVID guidline for eye hospitals" developed by quality and accreditation institute on behalf of Orbis International. The guideline was released on 12th November. In addition to all this, he participated in no. of webinars & studied various guidelines.

By the end of May 2020, we noticed that during Arpil & May - income from different sources had reduced substantially, we prepared donation request & sent to our regular donors through 'whatsapp', and here we thankfully note that they donated generously, though they may

be in a difficult situation in this pandemic. Words will fall short to express our gratitude towards the love they showered on us.

Application for Ethics Committee renewal was submitted in last week of May. Dr. Ashish Rastogi from C.T. quest imparted the online training to our Ethics committee members on 6th June. We sincerly appreciate their kind gesture of doing this online training free of cost. The permission for research on an Ayurvedic drug was granted in August. The monthly online meetings were arranged after wards.

Annual General meeting of our Co-operative Society was arranged on last Sunday of June. Secretary Shri Nalinbhai Shah hoisted the flag on 15th August.

The training of different category of staff was arranged during July-August 2020.

The online training about organization development is being conducted for core group members by Professor Hiteshbhai Bhatt (faculty of IRMA). First session was conducted on 17-9-2020 & then 6 more sessions were completed upto March-2021. This training will be helpful to create second cadre. We are thankful to Prof. Bhatt for doing this training free of cost.

Online Technical advisory committee meeting was conducted on 16th September.

Rapid test of Corona was done for all staff members during first week of October. Total 8-10 staff members suffered from corona but all got cured with home isolation and resumed their duty again.

For Amalsadi campus, new brochures were prepared, as now the land is registered in name of Divyajyoti Trust, after all legal requirements being completed. For construction work, tenders were floated. Foundation stone laying ceremony was performed in a limited gathering on 17th January in the presence of donors - well wishers; Hon. MP Shri Prabhubhai Vasava & Cabinet Minister Shri Ganpatbhai Vasava observing all corona guidelines & social distancing protocol. The construction work has started from 31st January. It is to note here that renowned actor Shri Pratik Gandhi is our brand ambassador for publicity of our new project.

We attended online meeting with founders of Mission for Vision & informed them about our activities. Mission for Vision is a big support for us.

Website of Divyajyoti Trust was upgraded during November.

Staff has been motivated to take COVISHIELD vaccine and 109 staff members took the 1st dose during January & 2nd dose during February-2021.

Short term training of doctors and visiting consultant activity was stopped due to corona, has been started again from March-2021.





#### Hospital 20

As stated earlier, the footfall of patients dropped substantially from last week of March-2020. Which increased again from 11th May 2020. During this period only 15 emergency surgeries were done.

The total OPD of 1450 patients was seen during the month of May (from 11th May to 31st May) & 178 surgeries were performed. The number of retina, cornea and glaucoma patients was noticeable.

During the year bilateral cataract surgery of 100 year old grandma was done and restored her sight. Another challenging task was of 8 months infant's surgery. Though we gave him antibiotics & cared for 15 days, but due to malnutrition we could not save his vision.


Again the work dropped from 20th July as corona cases increased in Mandvi town & surrounding area. After Diwali, it peaked up again and on 8th March the OPD was of 254 patients & 58 surgeries (the highest for the year).

Comprehensive fellow Dr. Yash Oza completed his tenure of one year & was relieved from June-2020; and Dr. Zalak Shah joined from January-2021 as comprehensive fellow.




Occuloplasty consultant Dr. Vasvi Joshi has started visiting on 2nd & 4th wednesday of each month from March-2021.

#### Ramilaben relieved from pain

55 years old Ramilaben resides at Vill. Amod with her husband. When visited Mandvi with her husband, had a complaint of severe pain, vision less & swelling in her right eye. She felt like vomiting due to severe pain. It all started 2-3 days before they visited the hospital.

At our hospital ophthalmologist examined her & started antibiotic injection. After that she had some relief. Our doctor suggested her to get CT scan done, after that it was confirmed that infection had not spread to brain but it was in orbit. There was an abscess (collection of pus) in her orbit. Which was confirmed by needle aspiration. Incision & drainage was performed to remove pus after prolonged counselling.

We kept her in hospital for almost 10 days to watch her and did regular dressings to make sure that the wound heeling occurs properly. After 10 days the infection was cured, and vision was restored in her right eye. She visited 2-3 times for followup and is happy as her complaint was totally resolved.

Ramilaben paid partial amount of total expense as her financial condition is not very good.



## Eye Bank

Eye donation is the best donation, but due to lack of awareness or some religious belief, people are hesitant in donating eyes. We have prepared video on eye donation information to generate awareness among community. Some of our staff members acted in the home produced video showing their acting ability.

In normal situation, we celebrate eye donation fortnight arranging cycle rally or motorcycle rally or school children's rally with posters on eye donation, to create awareness among community. But in this situation of corona, we provided best wishes to Drishti rath of Lokdrishti Eye Bank hoisting a flag & awareness generation was done using social media.

#### Diwaliba Optometry College

Inspection of optometry college was done by LIC on 1st September. The authority granted 5 years permission for optometry college. All the lectures were arranged online to continue the education of students and all were given practical training during August-September 2020.

Final exam was conducted in August for 3rd year students & in September for 2nd year students. All students cleared their exams.

Third year students were selected for internship with stipend and with their performance all the employers are happy, so all will be recruited as full time employee after completion of internship. This is a matter of pride for us.

The students of optometry college prepared slogans and painted posters in a competition to celebrate eye donation fortnight & won the prizes.

One video on information of optometry college is prepared.

All the students appeared in semester ending exam, conducted in March and cleared it.

#### Training and Education

We have opted for a strategy of imparting continuous training to our staff since beginning to improve their capacity & efficiency. During the year in house/online training of different category of staff was arranged as given in following table:

#### Publication 29

During free time, due to fall in regular activities due to COVID-19 situation, we prepared articles on study-research papers.

- (1) During July-August 2011 we had carried out one survey of "Rapid Assessment of Avoidable Blindness RAAB". On the basis of results found from this survey, we had prepared one research paper, which is now published in journal of ophthalmic epidemeology.
- (2) Our article on the basis of Rapid Assessment of Visual Impairment RAVI survey has been prepared and same is now published in the Open Scientific Publishers Journal of Ophthalmology in June-2020 version.
- (3) Revised cataract manual has been prepared for vision 2020 Right to Sight India 2020, which is published.
- (4) Dr. Suhal Shah prepared a poster on her work with our optometry students on psychiatry & has been presented at the American Association of Child & adolescent psychiatrists' virtual conference.
- (5) Dr. Udaybhai as a team member participated in formation of "post covid guidelines for eye hospitals" developed by Quality and Accreditation Institute on behalf of ORBIS international, which was released on 12th November 2020.

#### Long story of little Vaidik

11 months old Vaidik Ravidasbhai Vasava is third child of his parents. His elder sister is married and younger sister studies in school.

When Vaidik was 5 months old, his left eye was swollen & he was not opening the eye. So his parents carried him to Sagbara community health centre (CHC). There he was given some medicine but had no effect. When they visited for followup, doctor referred them to Mandvi with a warning that if they don't go, left eye of Vaidik will be lost.

When they visited Mandvi, our doctor examined him & said that due to some foreign particle fallen in the eye, there was an infection and cornea is spoiled and advised a corneal transplant surgery. Upon hearing about operation, first they were afraid, but after counselling and assurance of free surgery given, they were ready for the surgery.

Vaidik had severe cough & cold, so we kept him in our hospital and treated him with the help of a pediatrician for 15 days. We sent them back advising them to return again after Vaidik's health improves, but they did not turn up as they had no money for travelling. Again we counselled them and they visited hospital, after that corneal transplant surgery was done in presence of anesthetist.

After successful surgery, we discharged him & counselled his parents, for post operative care and asked them for followup visit.

Our counseller called them, when she noticed that they did not turn up for followup visit, but could not contact. Field work was also stopped due to corona.

Finally our Sagbara vision centre staff visited Nana Kakdiamba village but allas. The parents carried Vaidik to farm with them so could not contact, but his sister (Sandhya) was present at home and got her mobile number.

When we talked to Sandhya, she informed us that due to lack of money they did not turn up for follow up visit. After that our CBR supervisor visited them and helped with bus fare. After that they visited Mandvi. At hospital our doctor examined & found that corneal transplant had failed due to lack of postop follow up.

After so much efforts we could not save Vaidik's eye. Such is the situation of poor people in interior areas. All the hard work gets lost in poverty. A lot more needs to be done to improve the scenario in rural interior poverty stricken areas.



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#### Outreach Activity

#### **Diagnostic Camps**

Due to COVID-19 guidelines, camps were prohibited since March-2020. From December-2020 the permission was granted to start camp activity. During this period from March to December - 2020, we arranged to diagnose the patients at each vision centre; gave a particular date and arranged to and fro vehicle facility for the patients from base hospital. For this activity we observed covid guidelines very strictly. We allowed one person on one seat, keeping social distance, enforced patients to wear mask, getting rapid covid test done, use sanitisers etc.

We informed our camp sponsors about this different arrangements & requested them to sponsor patients at particular vision centres. Some of our regular donors sponsored these patients.

KAPS authority regularly sponsors one mega camp each year. But for this year it was not possible, so we did it differently. Our team including students carried out door to door survey in nearby villages of Kakrapar & found out the patients, arranged vehicle to transport them from their villages to Mandvi and planned for 100 operations.

#### രൂള് Netrang - Zankhvav Satellite Centre 🗝 👸

Ophthalmic Assistant Shri Rameshbhai Vasava of Netrang satellite centre was imparted the optical fitting training of one month and necessary equipments - instruments were provided at Netrang. Now patients of Netrang area are getting opticals within short period, hence sale of opticals increased substantially.

The operation theatre is also being functional, operations are being done regularly.

At Zankhvav satellitle centre, the ceiling of OT room needs repairing. Inspite of regular followup with competent authority, it is not repaired till date. The operation activity is held up.

#### Wyara Satellite Centre

Vyara satellite centre was handed over to Government of Gujarat to run as covid care centre for a long time, our activity is almost nil.

CBR project started from January-2018 was over in December-2020. The activity of CBR was also not done during March to December & new project is not being started due to Covid-19 situation.

Saiyadbhai becomes independent again

Saiyedbhai Diwan is a native of village Dolwan near Dahej but resides at Kosamba and earns as labourer. Some time ago, Saiyedbhai lost his vision, so his relatives took him to an eye hospital elsewhere. There, the cataract & retinal detachment surgery on right eye was done but his sight did not get restored. Left eye was ok at that time, so Saiyedbhai lived with one eye. After 15 years (at the age of 60), he lost vision in left eye also. He again visited some other eye hospital & got treatment there but could not gain vision.

Now, Sailedbhai lost vision bilaterally & became blind, so could not go outside for labour work and lived dependent life. His children started to go for earning. Some colleague of his daughter at some company

where she was working, suggested her to visit Mandvi Eye Hsopital.

At our hospital, it was found that due to retinal detachment, vision was lost in left eye and a surgery is needed. Saiyedbhai was not ready as he had under gone number of surgeries previously with no result. He was depressed and afraid of surgery. After a long counselling and assurance of free surgery, he agreed.

After surgery, he has vision in his left eye. Now he will live independently again & go outside for his work. His children will work without any tension. The family says that they had lost the hope for Saiyedbhai's vision but he got his vision again. All the members of Saiyedbhai's family are happy & thankful to Tejas Eye Hospital!!



#### Dediapada, Umarpada, Sagbara, Uchchhal, Bardoli, Khapar, Kim, Kosamba vision centres

The work started again from 11th May which was stopped from March-2020. Before starting work, online training was imparted to all vision centre's ophthalmic assistants, how to work in COVID-19 situation. The revision of training was done on 6th July. We provided necessary posters, consent form, sanitizer, mask, protective shield, thermal gun to check the temperature and medicines to all vision centres.

Field work was started from 3rd June and we collected patients through door to door visit, call the patients at vision centres and sent vehicles on fixed date at particular centre, brought them to Mandvi for surgery.

Optical fitting training was imparted to ophthalmic assistant of Khapar & Dediapada, so the sale of spectacles has increased. Pop in fit spectacles are also sold in small number.

From October onwards, patients are coming regularly from all vision centres for surgery.

During the year we had to shift the place of our Dediapada vision centre in Novmber-2020. At Kim vision centre, Shri Nagarbhai Lad of Ramkrishna Vivekanand Seva kendra is a great support to us. We are very much thankful to him.

We created a whatsapp group of welwishers from villages near by each vision centre. Through this group we can share the information of our vision centre's activity & community will be benefited by the same.

We arranged community meeting at Kim, Kosamba & Umarpada vision centres.

#### Spectacles Removed - Life Changed

A family from Allahabad - Uttarpradesh migrated to Surat since long. Family has a daughter - 22 years old Komal & 2 younger sons. When Komal visited Mandvi with her mother, wearing spectacles with very high minus number. She wanted to get rid of her glasses. Our doctor examined her thoroughly.

It was found that her retina of both eyes are weak since birth & thickness of cornea is less, so laser surgery to remove spectacles was not possible.

Looking to her age, her family was eager for her marriage but spectacles were hindrance. In such situation, we counselled her for a surgery of implanting a lens (called implantable phakik contact lens), so that spectacles can be removed. Generally such type of surgery is a costly affair but looking to their financial condition we did it at a subsidised rate.

We ordered the lens for Komal and called them again for surgery and after that she was operated in both eyes one after the other & she got normal vision without spectacles.

After surgery, marriage of Komal is fixed now. Her fiance is doing Government job. Komal & her family members are very happy & give blessings to hospital with tears in their eyes for good progress.

#### W Vivekanand Pragnachaksu Hostel

All the blind children were sent back to their home, as school was closed due to Covid-19 pandemic. All were brought back in November-2020.

Our donor agency "Mission for Vision" distributed ration kit to all our past & present blind children. We helped them by arranging vehicle to send ration kit to their doorsteps. The ration kit was sufficient for six months for each family.

On 26th January, Surat Andhjanshala distributed 8 mobile phones to our blind children.

Our wellwisher & donor Smt. Ashaben Shroff gifted 22 handwoven sweaters to our children. For this she also availed help of her sisters.

Vikrambhai who brought some other villager to Mandvi & got the successful surgery done, informed Sangitaben about availability of eye care free of cost for poor at Tejas Eye Hospital & she visited Mandyl.

At Mandvi our doctor examined her & diagnosed that due to trauma, Sangitaben had developed cataract & cornea was also torn. So doctors advised her for surgery, but she was afraid of the same. After long & thorough counselling, she got ready for the surgery.

First of all corneal tear was repaired & then cataract surgery was done. After that she got her vision again.

Sang taben has two children & a mother in law total 5 members at home to take care of. Due to her difficulty, she was unable to take care of her family but now her vision is restored, she is able to do her routine work. The family is very happy & thankful to Tejas Eye Hospital.



#### Community kitchen in service of patients 💥

Community kitchen is functional since beginning for indoor patients, their relatives, staff members, students as well as doctors and blind children.

Pure vegetarian food is served in this kitchen for camp patients & relatives; 1 tea-breakfast & 2 time meal is provided free of cost. For the staff, it costs Rs.15/- dish at subsidized rate & for OPD patients it costs Rs.40/- per dish.

The cost of kitchen (bhojanshala) is totally born by Chhanyado (Surat Manav Seva Sangh, Surat). We are very thankful to Chhayando for supporting kitchen activities for all these years.

Local people also occasionally donate ready made food or food grains for patients as well as blind children. The list of such donors is given separately.

Swami Savitanandji of Suryakanya Sadhnakutir, Tarsada village near Mandvi donates for purchase of cooking oil every year since last 4 years regularly. We are very much thankful to him.

## GO Financial Outlay

We are very happy to note that even in the tenth year; we have performed 67% operations totally free. The rest were either subsidised or paid. However, it is important to note that our charges are heavily subsidised against the prevalent market rates.

Total expenditure of the trust including hospital, diagnostic camps, training centre, research activities, C.B.R. programme, Vivekananda Pragnachakshu Bhavan, Janseva Medical & Optical store and staff welfare during the year was Rs. 8.80 crore including recurring and non-recurring expenses. Total recurring expenditure was Rs. 6.08 crore whereas total non-recurring expenditure was Rs. 2.72 crore.

Patient income has remained almost the same against the last year which came to Rs. 1.90 crore. It comes to 31.0% of the total recurring expenses. Apart from that, we receive support from District Blindness Control Society – reimbursement for free surgeries and from Rashtriya Suraksha Bima Yojana (RSBY scheme) – the insurance taken by the Govt. for the BPL families. Other than that, organisations like Vision Foundation of India, Mission for Vision, Helpage India, Combat Blindness Foundation etc. are of great help.


Kasturi bhojanshala which caters to the indoor patients & relatives, staff, blind children, guests and outstation OPD patients is getting support from Surat Manav Seva Sangh (Chhayando). Total number of dishes prepared and served is increasing year after year. However, it has reduced this year substantially due to corona. Similarly, the expenses for Vivekananda Pragnachakshu Bhavan comes from Poddar Tyres, Mumbai under their CSR programme. We sincerely appreciate continuous support received from them every year. However, local support from the Mandvi town is also significant for blind children.


The turnover of Janseva medical store has also increased and more and more patients are getting the benefits of the subsidised facility available here. Whatever little surplus we generate from this activity, is utilised to provide free spectacles and medicines to the poor patients. Training and consultancy services makes a small contribution

of 1.2 %. We have started Diwaliba Optometry College from 2017 under Uka Tarsadia University. All the expenses are born by us for the college. As the number of students is less, we had to give substantial amount of money to the college. All the remaining expenditure is managed through donations. We received 24.8% from Institutional donors and 23.0% through Individual donors. We are getting substantial support from Lilavati R. Shah Medical Relief Trust, Mumbai for treatment of poor patients.

Of the total recurring expenditure, we spent 87.4% on the hospital activities, 1.0% on camp activities, 1.1% on training and research activities, 9.3% on Community Based Rehabilitation activities and 1.2% on staff welfare activities.

With the grace of GOD, all these ten years, we never had a problem with the recurring expenses. We have to put in some efforts to generate donations BUT we are able to meet ends. We are sure, the same support will continue from donors and well wishers like you and many others even in future. We have taken up a major project to create a campus at Amalsadi. It will be a big expenditure of Rs. 35 crore in first phase and for that we will need support from all possible corners of the society.

One day Gita's sister-in-law came to know about the checkup campaign of Divyajyoti Trust, so she brought Gita & then they approached Mandvi Hospital for further checkup.

At Mandvi, ophthalmologist examined Gita & diagnosed bilateral cataract & counselled her for surgery. But Gita was afraid and her blood pressure shoot up. Our staff referred her to private physician at our cost, got her blood pressure under control.

After that our staff counselled again and said that we will not operate, but only eye drops will be instilled (we had to tell her a lie). So, she agreed and her pressure remained normal during surgery.

After surgery of one eye, she got vision and was able to see her sister & sister-in-law for first time. She was so excited to see them and agreed for second eye cataract surgery.

Now she is fully sighted person and very happy & will lead a normal life with colours in her life. Now she will not live a dependent miserable life but independent prosperous life.
