It gives us immense pleasure in presenting 14th annual report to you.

The 40 bedded Tejas Eye Hospital was started in May-2011 at Mandvi Dist. Surat to provide eye care services to the needy rural-tribal people. The hospital gained extremely positive response from patients and having deep feelings for patients it expanded up to 100 beds facility. But looking at the increasing work load, this facility also proved short in terms of physical infrastructure.

Considering the situation, one well-wisher & donor couple Shri Vijaybhai & Smt. Nipunaben Dalia - native of Mandvi, residing at Surat donated their land situated 3 km away from Mandvi –at Amalsadi in 2016. We started developing a new campus with all latest facility and now it is time to inaugurate the same. The formal inauguration is planned on 20th October 2024.

At the new campus, we have 200 bedded hospital,10 operation theaters all latest state of the art equipments, Netrajyoti training centre, Diwali Ba Optometry College, Hostel, staff quarters, Bhojanshala-canteen and the temple as well as large waiting area & parking facility. The detailed information is given on the cover page 2.

To develop this campus, we got tremendous help from our donors from all the corners of the society. Over and above donations, technical guidance and other support is also received from the kind hearted people of the society. We are very much thankful to all our donors, well-wishers & supporters.

The donors' task of giving donations and the task of construction are over. It is time for the team to perform and be helpful to the society to the poor population around us in particular. Our focus will remain on providing high quality care. We seek blessings of all the individuals and organisations who are helping us in one or the other way.

Year at a glance:

At the beginning of the year, our staff got a chance to save someone's life. The story is - our optometry college faculty Mrs. Shivaniben was travelling by bus to Mandvi for her duty. At that time, suddenly one young man had severe chest pain. Shivaniben had taken the CPR training and using presence of mind, she gave him CPR & instructed the bus conductor & the driver to drive the bus to a nearby CHC. They admitted the young fellow to that CHC for further treatment & thus his life was saved.

A get to gather of the past ophthalmic Assistant students was held on 30th April. The programme was very successful as most of the past students were present & shared their experiences with each other. Total 30 students attended the get-to-gather. We were happy to note that our students have made good progress & in general their performance is satisfactory.

On 1st May, a delegation from Japan visited our hospital in reference to research work. Dr. Yo Ishigaki & Prof. Dr. Handa from Japan & our hospital have collaborated for Amblyopia study. Under this study, we are treating amblyopia patients using the "tablet" computer specially developed by the company.

On 16th May; a team comprising of Nikhilbhai, Kaminiben, Sunitaben & Jigneshbhai visited Vadodara Universal Medicap co. It was with reference to understand & implement autoclaving method of linen-instruments etc. used in operation theatre by "gamma radiation."

This year annual day was celebrated on the 21st of May as it was Sunday. The blood donation camp was arranged in the morning & 27 bottles of blood was collected. In the evening, a staff with family get together was arranged. In the evening, there was the cultural programme followed by dinner. The DCB bank, under its CSR activity, distributed school bags to school going children of our staff members on the same day. On 22nd May, Ganesh Poojan was done & 5 couples participated in the same.

Our Khapar & Vyara centres are sponsored by Mission for Vision (MFV). Similarly truck driver's screening project was also sponsored by MFV. The organization naturally audits both our activities periodically. Ms. Gaurangi Kolzarkar visited Vyara centre as well as truck drivers' screening activities on 23-24th May for audit purpose. Mr. Debashis Maitee visited Vyara & Khapar centres during 3rd to 6th June to audit the activities & conducted CME sessions for ophthalmic assistants at Mandvi.

Lions club of Surat crystal sponsored 35 cataracts surgeries in June & 25 cataracts in August. Lions club of Surat Silk city also sponsored 10 cataract operations.

Rotary club of Surat Round town under its global grant-project donated equipments for one operation theatre at Amalsadi campus on $18^{\rm th}$ June.

On 26th of June, we got FCRA permission for the next five years which was awaited since long. This has facilitated our campus construction work immensely. We are thankful to Almighty for making this possible.

On 29th of July, we distributed 500 school bags & uniforms to school going children in five Ashramshala surrounding Mandvi. Similarly on 29th Sept., school







uniforms were distributed to the children of village Naren. This was made possible by donation from helping hand Surat; Shri Manas Mandal & Chhanyado from Surat facilitated by our trustee Shri Ramnarayanji Chandak.

On 6th August, equipments were handed over to Divyajyoti Trust by the District governor of Rotary club Mr. Shrikantbhai Indani & past district governor Mr. Kulbandhu Sharma under the global grant project.

On 8th August, Board meeting of vision 2020: right to sight, Gujarat chapter was held at Ahmedabad. Dr. Udaybhai attended the same. Vision 2020 right to sight India's annual conference was held on 26 - 27 August at Neemuch (M.P.). Dr. Udaybhai attended the same. He is a group member who worked for developing "outbreak policy" and the document was released during the conference. A team of 5 more staff members accompanied him.

It is a matter of pride that Dr. Udaybhai has been selected as the chairman of adverse event reporting committee of All India ophthalmology society.

Government body – "District blindness control society" conducted hospital inspection on 14-08-2023. This is done as a part of renewal process of MOU with DBCS.

To get the approval from ethics committee for research project, ethics committee meeting was held on 01-10-2023 and the approval was granted.

The world sight day was celebrated on 12th October & a session to generate awareness for eye care at work place was conducted at Vyara centre by our staff.

Mr. Debashis again visited Mandvi during 26th to 28th of October.

Dr. Aruna & Ms. Sashipriya from Arvind eye institute, Madurai visited Mandvi between 31st October to 2nd November to help us understand outcome analysis of cataract surgeries as a part of "LEAP series" to improve outcomes.

A get-to-gather of camps organisers was organized on 29th October. 40 persons attended the same & gave us suggestions for improvement.

Our innovative project-to screen people through autorefractor & provide spectacles to all the needy persons in 5 Lakh population was launched on 18th November (detailed information is given under outreach activities on page 16.)

Ninth vision centre at Ankleshwar was inaugurated on 24th November. Setting up of this centre is supported by M/S Sajjan India Ltd, Ankleshwar.

Mr. Debashis Maitee & Mr. Hemant Lohiya audited the activities of Vyara satellite centre on 24th November.

Retinopathy of prematurity (ROP) project for premature babies is going on. A get together of such babies & their parents was held on 1st October. Total 28 babies & their parents attended the gathering. We are pained to note that majority of parents are not bringing their babies for regular yearly follow-up in spite of repeated reminders. The funding of this project's implementation in Navsari district came from MFV. So Dr. Sheetalben from MFV visited our Navsari ROP project on 30st Nov. for audit & Mandvi ROP project on 1st December.









ISO certification audit was done on 19th of December followed by issuing of renewal certificate.

The inauguration of CBR project for Songadh Taluka was held on 11th January in presence of officers of M/s Sajjan India Ltd, Ankleshwar - Ms.Prutha Harshjeet, Mr. Praveen Joshi & Mr. Deshraj Bansal. This is the 4th project after completion of CBR projects for Mandvi, Mangrol - Umarpada & Vyara Talukas.

The republic day (26th January) was celebrated in presence of Shri Varsheshbhai Shah of Smit laboratory, Mandvi.

The inspection of Divyachakshu eye bank was conducted on 15/02/24 and the HOTA (Human Organ Transplant Act) license & Eye bank license were renewed on 23/3/24 for 5 years.

The renewal of waste disposal registration under Gujarat Pollution Control board was done on 15/03/24.

During this year, donation of 10 second hand computers was received from Tata consultancy Services, Gandhinagar.

We have Recruited 2 blind persons, adding 3 already existing - total 5 blind persons are there as our regular staff. (1 is braille teacher, 1 Housekeeping staff & 3- computer operators.)

Cataract removed, Life Changed!!

Vasuben (name changed) is native of Zankhvav (Tal. Mangrol) and unmarried, so resides with her siblings as her parents have died. She had dimness of vision since last one year.

Vasuben was well aware of Mandvi Eye Hospital. So, one fine day she visited the hospital with her niece.

At Mandvi, she was examined thoroughly and doctors found that there was cataract in both her eyes but left eye cataract was matured so it was necessary to do left eye surgery first. Vasuben had some savings from her meagre income, but she decided to pay for surgery and her surgery was done implanting Indian lens.

During her surgery, surgeon found worm in the conjunctival sac, so for some period of time, tension arose but immediately our laboratory staff took out worm and tested and gave report that it was dead. All felt relieved and surgery was completed.

Now after left eye surgery, she got vision and will come for right eye surgery soon.

Vasuben & her siblings are happy & say that now they will send other people also for such type of complaint to Tejas Eye Hospital.


Dr. Krutika Patel joined us as comprehensive fellow from 1st December 2023 & Dr. Disha Jariwala from 1st August 2023.


Dr. Astha Patel completed her fellowship in June 23 & joined as a consultant from 1st August 2023.



Mayaben Got New life!!!

62 years old Mayaben (Name changed) is native of Surat. Her son earns his bread & butter by doing miscellaneous work. As she grew old and had dimness of vision, could not do much work.

Mayaben's son took her to some hospital in Surat and retina surgery in right eye was done there. But she needed retina surgery in left eye also. So they inquired for that. At Surat, the cost of surgery was very high & their PMJAY card was also not accepted. Additionally, Mayaben had cardiac problem also. Her heart function was only 20%, so nobody was ready to take risk.

Meanwhile, her brother in law got admitted to Mandvi for cataract surgery and her son was also there with his uncle. Mayaben's son inquired for retina surgery and Ayushman card in detail. When Mayaben visited the hospital, her retina examination was completed and given nearest date for surgery. There was a risk of her heart problem, but we got fitness certificate from physician, arranged for anaesthetist & done surgery successfully.

Now, she is able to do her daily routine work and gained her confidence back.

She gives message to the society that those who became blind due to poverty, she will help them & serve the poor with the best of her capacity.









Speciality Clinic

- a.) Cornea Clinic: -Dr.Pinkal Shiroya joined as cornea consultant from 3rdApril & left from February 24 .Dr. Himarshi Mehta –Shukla joined as cornea fellow from 14th August. However Dr. Darshanbhai Kalaigar visits on weekly basis as well as Dr. Rohanbhai Thakkar visits twice in a month and takes care of cornea patients. Corneal transplant surgery during the year was 147. b.) Glaucoma Clinic: -Glaucoma consultant Dr. Mansi Desai left in the middle of the year hence no full time consultant is present but Dr. Priteshbhai Desai is taking care of Glaucoma patients regularly.
- c.) Retina Clinic: -Retina consultant Dr. Kavin Shroff is taking care of Retina patients. The new constellation machine was installed in October 23, so sutureless vitrectomy operations are now being carried out. Over & above retina patients, under ROP project retinal examination & treatment of premature babies are taken care of by him. The statistical detail of ROP project is given in table no. 7
- <u>d.) Paediatric Clinic:</u> -Paediatric Ophthalmologist Dr. Uma Shroff is taking care of paediatric patients. Over & above this, research work is also done among which one Amblyopia study is carried out in collaboration with Japanese company.
- <u>e.) Oculoplasty: -</u>Oculoplasty consultant Dr. Shalin shah from Vadodara visits once a week (on Tuesday) & takes care of oculoplasty patients. In addition, Dr. Ishant Sethi from Surat visits twice a month and takes care of these patients.

During this year, on 13th February, endonasal DCR surgery was done by Dr. Shalin Shah, which is first of its kind for Divyajyoti Trust.



Sunny's Confidence Restored!!

10 years old sunny (name changed) is native of Dodhanwadi and lives with his parents including six members in family. As a child, he was very enthusiastic & playful but after getting admitted in school, his playfulness and enthusiasm reduced. His father thought that it may be because he has to give attention to his studies. But it was not the case. Sunny's teacher told the father that sunny cannot see the picture at far distance, not only that but also he could not see nearer objects!! So they went to spectacle shop and bought Spectacles for sunny. Now he was again as enthusiastic & playful as before.

When he entered 4th standard (at age 10), he again broke his spectacles and got a new one. Meanwhile our camp was organised in his school and in camp, it was diagnosed that sunny had bilateral cataract.

Our counsellor explained to his parents that after cataract surgery, Sunny will have normal vision. Somehow, they did not turn up for three months. After 3 months, they visited hospital but at that time sunny had cold & fever. So, we admitted him for 3-4 days and treated him for cold. We had hard time to convince them for surgery, but after a long counselling they agreed for surgery. His surgery was carried out successfully in presence of anaesthetist.

After one eye surgery, second eye was also operated and after that he is now able to see again. His enthusiasm is regained and he is as playful & cheerful as before.

His parents are happy looking at the shine on their son's face & bless hospital for future progress.









Divyachakshu Eye Bank

As mentioned earlier, licence for eye bank was renewed as well as permission under HOTA act was also received .

The awareness at local level for eye donation is increasing gradually. This year, we got eye donation from Mandvi in june.

Eye bank fortnight is celebrated every year between 25th August to 8th sept. This year, we have celebrated this fortnight by organising following programmes.

- Pamphlets regarding eye donation awareness were distributed to all our OPD patients during the fortnight.
- (2) A rally of school children of Mandvi & Umarzar schools carrying posters displaying eye donation slogans was organised on 29thAug.
- (3) A get togathar of the family members who have donated eyes and those who received donation was organised on 3rd september. Dr. Prafulbhai Shiroya of Lokdrashti Eye bank, Surat was the chief guest for the function.
- (4) Sessions on Eye donation awareness were arranged in rural areas.

Marriage saved, family saved!!

This is a tragic story of 29 years old lady Leela (name changed) of village Dharampur, Dist. Valsad. When she was studying in 7th standard (age approx. 14 years), she had complaint of watering from eye, hence her father carried her to Vansda Hospital. At Vansda hospital, doctors explained them that they have no specialist doctor with them & girl is too young to be operated & gave some medicine (eye drops). Leela & her father approached other hospitals also but all in vain!! They kept on putting eye drops and moved forward.

Eventually, Leela was grown up and got married but she had that complaint unresolved. Meantime, she became mother of two children. Once, as eye drops were finished, she had inflammation, pain & pus also in the corner of her eye. In such a situation, her husband started quarrelling with her instead of supporting!! At one point, it became the matter of divorce!! Helpless lady went to her father's house. During this period, a diagnostic camp was held by Divyajyoti Trust and Leela visited it.

From camp site, Leela came to Mandvi and was diagnosed with chronic dacryocystitis. Our visiting oculoplasty surgeon operated first on the right eye and after 11 days on the left eye.

Now, after both eye surgeries, her complaint is resolved. Now, Leela is living with her husband & children happily, but there was a time when her married life was threatened.

Leela's father says such type of facility &staff are very rarely seen. He is thankful to the hospital for solving his daughter's problem."

He will refer other people to this hospital for similar problem.









Diwaliba Optometry College

This year, 7thbatch of optometry students got admission and study started from 15.12.2023. This year, we planned home visit of each & every student to evaluate their social as well as financial conditions. The other objective was to develop strong relation with their parents.

For pass out students, we organised campus interviews at our hospital. 100% placement of optometry students is achieved since beginning. On 22.05.2023, Lenskart company's officers interviewed our optometry students, offerred them starting salary of Rs 28000/- per month & selected all the 9 students.

Two students got Rs.35,000/- as starting salary – one at Mumbai & the other in Una (Saurashtra). We arrange special training for soft skill development of our students at Maliba campus, Ukatarsadia university. This year it was arranged during 12th to 16th June.

The faculty development programme(FDP) for the faculty members was arranged between 18thmay to 28thMay at Uka Tarsadia University campus and our vision assistant course faculties (1) Miss Nidhi prajapati (2) Miss Nidhi Chaudhari (3) Shri Alpesh Mistry (4) Mrs. Dipika vasava (5) Mrs. Akruti Chaudhari participated in the training. Convocation of 3rdbatch students was organised on 4thFebruary 2024 at Maliba campus. The degree certificates were handed over to the students by our training centre administrator Mr. Vimal Prajapati.

The world sight day was celebrated on 23.3.24 in collaboration with Lenskart company.

This year, get to gather of past optometry students was held on 25.12.23 & large no. of students attended the same and had shared their experiences with each other. The studentsexpressed their pleasure about the training they received from the college. Dr. Pritiben Kapadia (HOD), Ophthalmology department, Government Medical College, Surat was the chief guest for the function.

Outreach Activities

A. Retinopathy of Prematurity (ROP) Project:

Under ROP project, retina checkup of pre mature & low birth weight babies is being done on regular basis and timely treatment saves babies from blindness. However there was nobody to sponsor this project, during this year, we still continued the same. For Narmada District-at Rajpipla, "Joy of Helping" sponsored this project and lately for Navsari district, approval from Mission for vision was received. But for other places, where we have continued ROP project, there was no sponsor available.

B. Diagnostic Camp:

Our diagnostic camps are very popular since beginning of our hospital. During initial stages, for publicity of camp, we were sending four-wheeler with a driver & a staff to distribute pamphlets, posters with a loudspeaker. This method was in practice for a long period. But from this year (Sept. 23), we have changed system of camps publicity. From Sept. 23, the leader/ Sarpanch of the area where camp is to be held, takes responsibility for publicity of camps. We provide our pamphlets/posters etc. to them for publicity of camps and involve them in this job.

This year, total 243 camps were organized. The OPD examination of 28040 people was done. 4753 patients were referred for cataract. 1328 patients referred for speciality work, among them 169 patients visited Mandvi. Spectacles dispensed were 11871 and medicine sold was 1571 nos. Total surgery done was 2143 among patients referred from camp.

C. Truck Drivers' Screening camps:

It is very well known that truck drivers spend most of their time on roads. So hardly find the time for their health checkup or eye screening. Considering this, we thought that if their eye checkup camps are arranged, we can contribute in avoiding accidents due to poor vision!! So, we arranged truck drivers' eye checkup camps on weekly basis and dispensed spectacles if required. During the year, 3000 truck drivers were screened. This programme was sponsored by Mission for Vision.

Looking at the importance of eye checkup of truck drivers, local toll booth operators also sponsored 3 such camps.









D.) Satellite Centres & Vision Centres:

This year, in November'23 - 9th vision centre of Divyajyoti Trust was inaugurated at Ankleshwar GIDC, (sponsored by Sajjan India Ltd., Ankleshwar). This is in collaboration with Vivekanand Seva Kendra, Ankleshwar. In fact, the centre is within their premises.

The surgeries at Netrang & Vyara satellite centres are regularly done and large no.of patients are being benefited but at Zankhvav satellite centre, operation theatre walls & ceiling has been broken since long and in spite of regular follow up, Govt. authority did not respond. So, for Zankhvav satellite centre, we run OPD & for surgery, patients are referred to Mandvi.

During the year, Sagbara vision centre was shifted to Selamba. Similarly Uchchhal vision centre was also shifted from one place to another. New land lord of Uchchhal centre is very kind and gave concession in rent as well as arranged meal for indoor patients. One another gentleman provided facility of drinking water.

A community meeting was held at Netrang satellite centre on 19-06-23 to share information about our activities to local community. 60 villagers attended the same. Similarly at Selamba vision centre, community meeting was arranged on 10-10-23, 28 people were present there.

In old age life, improved!!

70 years old Babukaka (Name changed) is native of village Navi Nagari Tal. Mangrol. At this old age, he has support of his wife only because one of his two sons has died during corona pandemic and the other one resides with his in laws. The couple earn their bread & butter through agricultural labour work.

Since last one year, Babukaka had dimness of vision in his both eyes and after Holi (March-April), he lost his vision totally. Now, the whole responsibility fell on kaki's headhis wife including earning, household work, to take care of Babukaka & so on.

Unfortunately, our village people still believe in traditional healers (Bhagat-Bhuva) so kaka & kaki approached them also but all in vein. At last, they visited Mangrol CHC. From Mangrol, they were referred to Mandvi but Babukaka was unable to travel so did not come.

One fine day, Babukaka's landlord visited him and brought him to Mandvi. Babukaka was seated on wheelchair and his thorough examination was done. Our counsellor assured him for free surgery and he was convinced.

Both eyes were operated one by one after that he got vision again.

Now, Balukaka will take care of his routine work & his wife will do her daily routine work independently & earn their wages. Both are happy & pray to God for progress of hospital.







Songadh CBR Project

Once it was decided to start Community Based Rehabilitation Programme for the blind in Songadh taluka, we arranged interview to select CBR workers. After selecting them, 1" module training was started from 23-10-23.

After the training was completed, door to door survey in the villages of Songadh taluka started from 1" November. The camps for curably blind people, screened by CBR workers were started from 18th November 23.

The CBR project of Songadh taluka is sponsored by Sajjan India Ltd., Ankleshwar, so formal inauguration of the project was held on 11th January 2024 in the auspicious presence of the officers of Sajjan India Ltd., Ankleshwar-Chief human resource officers Ms. Prutha Harshjith; Mr. Pravinkumar Joshi & Mr. Deshraj Bansal were present in the function. About 70 people attended the function & promised us to provide all possible support from their side.

The community meeting was held on 21" March 2024.

The separation of curable &incurable patients was done during 20th to 23rd March -24.

Spectacles Project

USA based donor Shri Manubhai Shah sponsored the project to provide spectacles to all needy people in 5 lac population in one year.

This project was taken up by Divyajyoti Trust in collaboration with Shrimad Rajchandra hospital and Shrimad Rajchandra Sarvamangal Trust, Dharampur.

The readymade spectacles are provided at token charge of Rs. 20/- per spectacles & the tailor-made spectacles are provided at Rs. 50/- per spectacle. For this project, 3 portable autorefractor machines & two 7 seater Ertiga cars were provided by Shrimad Rajchandra hospital authority to Divyajyoti Trust.

The project was started from November 23. The Progress of the project is given below.



Vivekanand Pragnachaksu Bhavan

We had started blind childrens' hostel from June-13, so in June 23 the hostel has completed 10 years. The blind students, who have studied earlier, completed their studies & some are pursuing their higher studies. Looking at the progress of these children, we have a feeling of satisfaction & happiness. We arrange workshops (shibir) twice a year so that all the past students meet present students & share their experience with each other.

This year, Diwali shibir was arranged on 30th November. 26 children were present and they had a picnic to Dakor, Ranchhodrai Temple. Similarly during summer, shibir was held during vacation -19 children attended the same & they visited Nareshwar.

These children prepared "rakhi" during festivals of Rakshabandhan & "Diya" during Diwali period. Our blind children participated in Drama-"Ramkatha" held in Mandvi. Presently, there are 14 students in the hostel. One student was sent to residential school at Mogri, Anand during the year.

Our blind children participated in "Khel Mahakumbh" at Vyara & won the prizes worth Rs. 52000/-

Our maintenance department people prepared special goggles with sensors which gives 'bip'sound when some object comes in front of the path of a blind person. Similarly, "Smart On" device which is able to identify person; navigates direction; recognizes currency note as well as read a book were given to total 15 blinds by Shri Dindayal Mohta- Donor from Surat as per the recommendation of our trustee Shri Ramnarayanji Chnadak.

Financial Outlay

Day by day work load is increasing and it is natural that the total running cost has also increased. But by Grace of God, we are able to manage recurring expenses. In this 13th year also, 65.52% surgeries were performed totally free. Rest, 7.79% at subsidised rate and 26.69% with full payment.

Total recurring & non-recurring expenditure of Divyajyoti trust including hospital, outreach activities including diagnostic eye camps, training centre, research, community based rehabilitation, Vivekananda Pragnachakshu Bhavan, Janseva medical & optical store and staff welfare, all put to gether has come to Rs. 18.66 crores. Of which, Rs. 8.94 crore was recurring expenses and Rs. 9.72 crores was non-recurring expenditure.

Of the total income of Rs. 19.54 crores, Rs. 8.91 crores was recurring income and Rs. 10.63 crores was non-recurring. Direct patient income was Rs. 2.69 crores which is 30.08% of the total recurring expenditure. Per surgery reimbursement from District Blindness Control Society (Rs. 1.64 crore – 18.93% of the total recurring income) was a substantial support. Reimbursement of free surgeries on poor patients under Rashtriya Suraksha Bima Yojana (now converted into Ayushman Bharat Scheme) is also received (Rs. 83 lacs.) In addition to all these, assistance from Vision Foundation of India, Mission for Vision, Pentagon charitable foundation etc. was also substantial.


Kasturi Bhojanashala provides food to patients, relatives, students and staff etc. is financially supported by Chhayando- Surat Manav Seva Sangh. We sincerely appreciate their help over all these years. Swami Savitanandji from Tarsada provides for all the cooking oil needed for the year since last many years. Poddar tyres, Mumbai is supporting our Vivekananda Pragnachakshu Bhavan under their CSR head since last many years. The support from local citizens of Mandvi town for the blind children is also noteworthy.


Divyajyoti trust takes care of all the deficit of Diwali Ba Optometry College after the income from students. That activity is also dependent on donations. There are sponsors available for vision assistant students 10 students are sponsored by Joy of Helping, USA.

Corporates and industrial donors provides for 22.9% of the total income. Individual donors contribute 7.0% of the total income. Here, we would like to take note of regular yearly support from Lilavati R. Shah medical relief trust, Mumbai for treatment of poor patients.

Out of the total recurring expenditure 58.9% was towards hospital activities, 13.3% towards training and research and 23.3% towards all outreach activities which included diagnostic eye camp activity, satellite centres, vision centres, ROP screening, school screening etc.

The construction work will be completed before the end of financial year 2024-25. Here also actual expenditure is far more than expected as usual. There is a shortage of approximately 3 to 4 crore rupees. We expect that this also will be fulfilled and project will be completed.

- Vyara and Bardoli on Taptyvalley line are the nearest railway stations about 30 kms away.
- On the main line from Mumbai to Ahmedabad, Kim which is 40 kms away is the nearest railway station. Buses are available to reach Mandvi from Kim.
- For people coming from Mumbai, Surat is the nearest railway station. It is 65 kms away. Buses are available at one hourly frequency and it takes little more than 2 hours to reach Mandvi from Surat.

After this surgery, retinal surgery was also done and finally fourth surgery was done for IOL implant. During all 4 Surgeries, she was admitted number of times but finally her vision is restored. It is really grace of God to efforts of human being.

Looking at the financial condition of Anju's family, we have done total treatment at subsidised rate. Anju's parents are very happy and say that the treatment of hospital is excellent as well as staff is very hard working. They pray to God that hospital may continue the service to needy patients.
